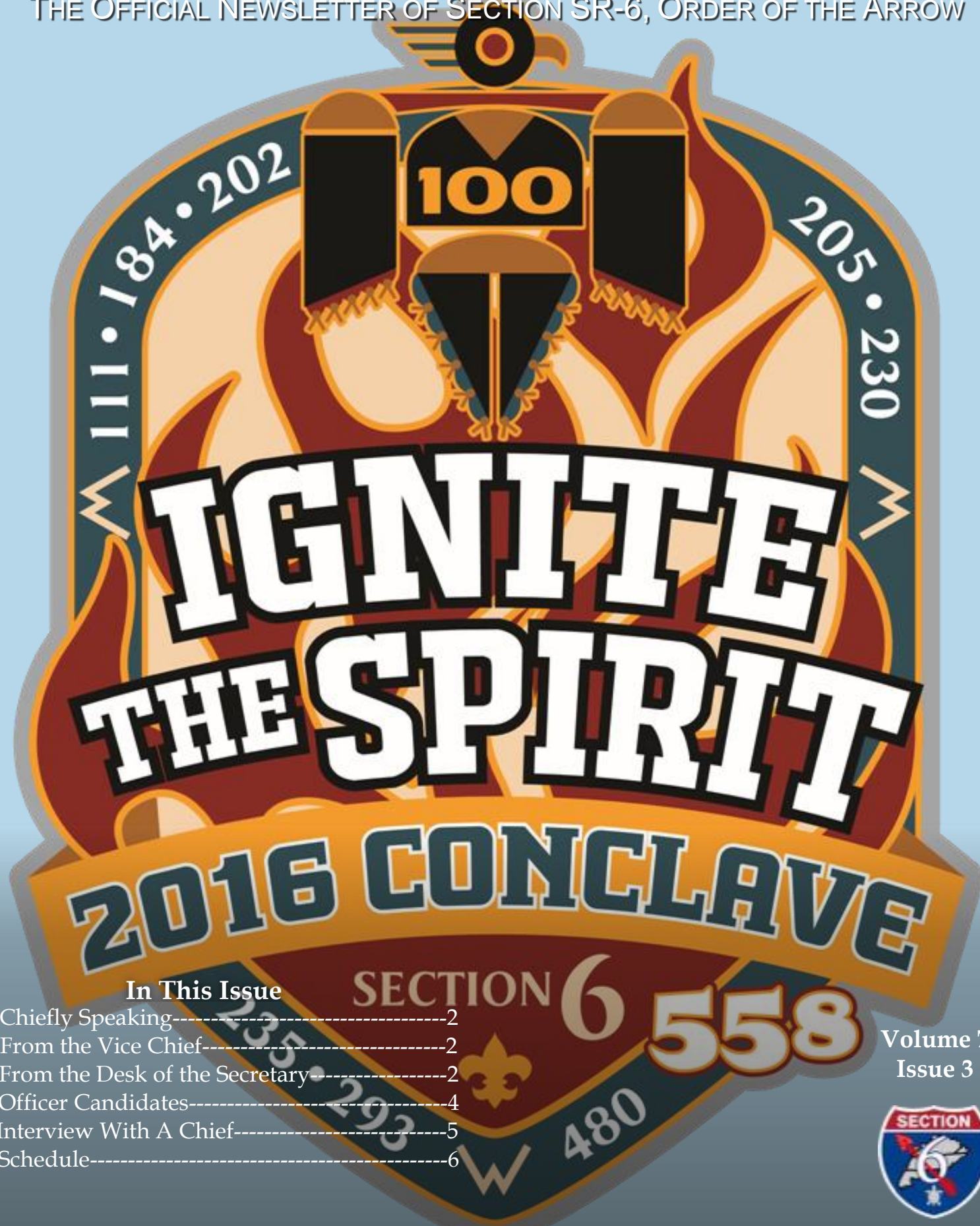

The transition in January could

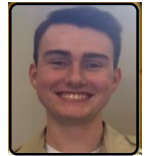
not have gone smoother, and I

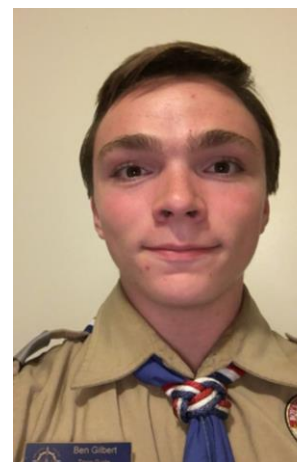

One hundred years ago, Camp Kia Kima had its first campers, thanks to Bolton Smith. Smith, the first president of the local Chickasaw Council, paved the way for thousands of young people who loved the woods and camping, gathering at this camp in the Ozarks near the South Fork River.

Originally, Scouts rode a train into Hardy, Arkansas from Memphis, Tennessee. From the train station, they hiked the terrain to camp, leading a team of horse drawn wagons carrying in their gear. What awaited them at camp? Kia Kima campers were divided into tribes, stayed in lodges and eventually stone cabins. Soon, the camp contained a hospital, a dining hall, and the famous Thunderbird Lodge.

With the outbreak of the second world war, the camp temporarily closed, but by 1948, Scouts returned to Hardy for the camping season. That same year, the Chickasaw Council held their first ordeal at Kia Kima, with ceremonies performed by Ittawamba Lodge. The next year, Chickasaw Lodge gained its first charter, under the number 406.

1963 was another big year for Kia Kima, as it moved to its current location. The original land now serves as Cherokee Village, which you may have seen on your way to camp. With 860 acres, several construction projects, and a new name, Kia Kima Scout Reservation was moving ahead at a very quick pace.

The camp you see today has seen its fair share of Scouts, changes, and history, and that is why we at Ahoalan Nachpikin love it so. From summer camp to fall fellowships, Kia Kima Scout Reservation never fails to provide memories and good experiences for Scouts and Scouters of all ages, from across our council, country, and the last century. We hope you enjoy your stay at Kia Kima, and that it impacts you the same way it has all of us.

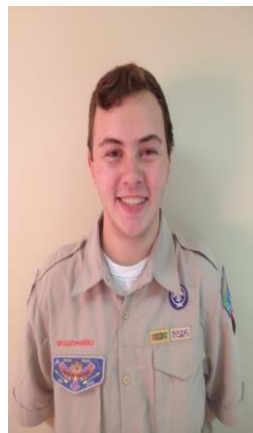
