How to get Started:

Lodge Coordinator: Appoint a Lodge One Day Coor-

dinator and send his name, address, and telephone number to your Section Coordinator! The Lodge Coordinator can be a Lodge Officer or any other responsible youth from your Lodge. He will spearhead your Lodge's One Day promotion and organization efforts so be sure to appoint a reliable youth.

<u>Choose a project:</u> With the help of your LEC and Lodge Adviser, select a service project to benefit the

community in which your lodge members live. A firm project should be decided upon no later than mid-July to ensure prior proper planning and promotion.



<u>Promotion</u>: The easiest way to inform your Lodge members of the One Day program and get them

excited about it are promotions at your Fellowships and ads in your Lodge publications. Short promotions at Lodge business and LEC meetings are easy, but definitely necessary. Also, include information in your Council newsletter, if you can, to set the example for everyone in the Council. Your Lodge should begin planning now! Remember, we want to perform community service pro-

These words from the founder of the Order of the Arrow ring true to all that have experienced high adventure at a National or World Jamboree, NOAC, Philmont Trek, Wilderness Voyage, OA Ocean Adventure, or a trip to Philmont, Northern Tier or Sea Base. Have you made plans for 2006? If not, now is the time. You can sign up for Philmont Trek, Wilderness Voyage, or OA Ocean Adventure for 2006 now at www.oa-bsa.org. Your Lodge is making preparations to attend NOAC next summer at Michigan State University, and you can sign up now. There is always the possibility of serving on summer camp staff at your council camp. While serving on summer camp staff may not be considered high adventure by some, there is plenty of adventure to be found while serving on camp staff. There also is an opportunity to sign up for the World Jamboree in 2007 at London, England, which will celebrate the 100th year of the founding of Boy Scouts. Follow the words of the founder and make adventure part of your planning for 2006 and beyond.

Another important consideration in planning for next year is your plan for participation in the Order of the Arrow.
