

food baskets to shut-ins, food kitchens for the hungry, clothing drives for the needy and many other forms of charity. All of these efforts are noteworthy for the assistance provided to those in need and the sense of community derived from providing service. Order of the Arrow lodges contribute to this service, most notably through One Day of Service, but also from other community service activities that are now required to qualify as a Quality Lodge. Your Lodge can contribute to this effort to rebuild Camp Tiak. Chicksa Lodge and Ittawamba Lodge are making plans. Consider this opportunity as a once in a lifetime chance to give service to Scouting that will make a real difference in the Scouting experience of the many boys affected by Hurricane Katrina. 
